

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF NEW CONCORD, OHIO

ORDINANCE NO. B-12-02-1

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE PERMIT PARKING ON VARIOUS STREETS WITHIN THE VILLAGE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

WHEREAS, the available parking areas are limited in the West High Street area because of the terrain and the closeness of the houses; and

WHEREAS, regulating on-street parking is in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the West High Street residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of New Concord that:

Section 1. The following residential parking zones are hereby established from September 1 through April 30 and are applicable during the hours of 6:00 p.m. – 6:00 a.m.

A. West High Street from Comin Street to Lincoln Lane.

Section 2. Parking of any motor vehicle is prohibited on a public street within the Residential Permit Parking Zone unless such motor vehicle displays a valid permit issued by the Village. The Police Chief may suspend the permit parking regulations for special community events and for street construction and repair projects in the general area.

Section 3. Persons residing in housing directly facing streets designated in Section 1 (above) may obtain up to 3 permits per property and may also obtain special temporary permits as determined by the Police Chief to park their motor vehicles, and for their guests to park their motor vehicles within the Residential Permit Parking Zone. The Police Chief shall issue rules and regulations governing the manner in which persons shall qualify for and receive parking permits.

Section 4. Appropriate signs shall be erected to assist in effectuating this section.

Section 5. Permits shall be displayed on motor vehicles in a manner determined by the Police Chief.

Section 6. A permit shall not guarantee or reserve for the holder an on-street parking space within the Residential Permit Parking Zone or exempt the permit holder from parking restrictions or prohibitions established pursuant to authority other than this section.

Section 7. The following acts are unlawful and in violation of this section:

- a. Standing or parking a motor vehicle on any street within a Residential Permit Parking Zone without properly displaying a valid permit issued by the Village.
- b. Providing false information to the Village with the purpose of obtaining a parking permit.

- c. Allowing the use or display of a parking permit on a motor vehicle other than that for which the permit was issued.
- d. Copying, producing or otherwise bringing into existence a facsimile or counterfeit parking permit.
- e. Using or displaying a facsimile or counterfeit parking permit without written authorization of the Village.
- f. Displaying or failing to surrender a parking permit revoked by the Police Chief.

Section 8. The Police Chief is authorized to revoke the residential parking permit of any person found to be in violation of this section.

Section 9. Any motor vehicle parking upon a public street in violation of this section is hereby declared a public nuisance.

Section 10. A violation of any provision of this section is a minor misdemeanor on a first offense. On each subsequent violation, a violation of any provision of this section is a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. Any motor vehicle parking in violation of this section is immediately subject to towing at the direction of the Police Department. Vehicle owners shall pay towing and storage charges prior to the release of the motor vehicle.


Section 11. For the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, this ordinance shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.




